The mission of the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) Water Resources Discipline is to provide the information and understanding needed for wise management of the Nation's water resources. Inherent in this mission is the responsibility of collecting data that accurately describe the physical, chemical, and biological attributes of water systems. These data are used for environmental and resource assessments by the USGS, other government agencies and scientific organizations, and the general public. Reliable and quality-assured data are essential to the credibility and impartiality of the water-resources appraisals carried out by the USGS.

A preliminary version of the programming language Pascal was drafted in 1968. It followed in its spirit the Algol-60 and Algol-W line of languages. After an extensive development phase, a first compiler became operational in 1970, and publication followed a year later (see References 1 and 8, p.14). The growing interest in the development of compilers for other computers led to a consolidation of Pascal, and two years of experience in the use of the language dictated a few revisions. This led in 1973 to the publication of a Revised Report and a definition of a language representation in terms of the ISO character set. This booklet consists of two parts: The User Manual, and the Revised Report. The Manual is directed to those who have previously acquired some familiarity with computer programming, and who wish to get acquainted with the language Pascal. Hence, the style of the Manual is that of a tutorial, and many examples are included to demonstrate the various features of Pascal. Summarising tables and syntax specifications are added as Appendices. The Report is included in this booklet to serve as a concise, ultimate

reference for both programmers and implementors. It defines standard Pascal which constitutes a common base between various implementations of the language.
